



Second Harvest Japan Further Expands Food Assistance Programs with Financial Assistance from Nu Skin Japan

Tokyo, 20 December 2006 – Second Harvest Japan, a unique non-profit corporation operating a food bank system, has announced that it has received a grant of 18 million yen (monthly 1.5 million yen) from Nu Skin Japan's "Force for Good Fund". With this grant, Second Harvest Japan will be able to further energize and expand its food assistance programs to help provide food to the needy throughout Japan.

Second Harvest Japan retrieves the perfectly good food donated from the food companies, which goes to waste in Japan for reasons including damaged packaging, mislabeling, ordering errors, or being close to the sell-by-date, and places donated food into the hands of those who can benefit the most, such as people in orphanages, women's shelters, aged care facilities, and low income families. In 2005, Second Harvest Japan delivered over 175 metric tons of food valued at over 105 million yen to partner agencies and individuals in Tohoku, Kanto, Chyuetsu, Kansai, and Kyushu areas. Taking full advantage of the grant provided by Nu Skin Japan, Second Harvest Japan will increase its storage capacity and further expand the existing emergency food assistance program called the "Food Pantry Program", which aims to deliver food packages to those in need via a home-delivery service.

Mr. Robert S. Conlee, President of Nu Skin Japan, commented on the support for Second Harvest. "As part of our social contribution activities, Nu Skin Japan has supported various organizations that act in Japan to create a better world. Second Harvest not only extends humanitarian assistance by providing food to needy people but also redistributes healthy donated food that would otherwise go to waste. Donations from Nu Skin Japan Distributors combined with corporate donations provide needed financial assistance to Second Harvest. Nu Skin Japan Staff and Distributors also volunteer their time to actively provide support to beneficiaries of the Second Harvest program.
